All nurses, including nursing students, need basic knowledge of nursing management to assure the quality of nursing care. It includes a wide range of subjects from nursing organization theory, nursing service management theory, human resource management theory, nursing management theory, nursing economic theory, patient safety studies to nursing systems and policy theory.

And, this course examines career development for nurses to become nurses who can support patients' decision-making and make policy recommendations to improve the quality of nursing care, and who can autonomously develop their own nursing careers.

It is necessary to consider the role that nursing management will play in the development of multidisciplinary and regional cooperation in the future.
